Information

This form is required to be submitted by an insurance company paying a claim on a vehicle deemed salvage or nonrepairable that is retained by the owner. This report must be filed within 30 days if the insurance company does not acquire ownership of the vehicle. The insurance company must provide notice of this report to the vehicle owner and advise the owner of the conditions regarding the vehicle operation. Do not submit this form if the motor vehicle is not damaged to the extent that it meets the definition of a salvage or nonrepairable vehicle.

Definitions

A salvage motor vehicle:

- has damage to or is missing a major component part to the extent that the cost of repairs exceeds the actual cash value of the motor vehicle immediately before the damage. Cost of repair calculations may include parts and labor, but must exclude the cost of materials and labor for repainting the motor vehicle and sales tax on the total cost of repairs, or
- comes into this state under an out of state salvage motor vehicle title or similar out of state ownership document.

A salvage motor vehicle is not:

- an out of state motor vehicle with a "rebuilt," "prior salvage," or similar notation, or
- a nonrepairable motor vehicle, or
- a motor vehicle which an insurance company has paid a claim for the cost of repairing hail damage or theft unless the motor vehicle was damaged during the theft to the extent that the cost of repair exceeds the actual cash value immediately before the damage. A salvage motor vehicle may not be registered or operated on a public highway until the vehicle has passed a Texas vehicle safety

inspection and a certificate of title branded "Rebuilt Salvage" has been issued.

A nonrepairable motor vehicle:

- is damaged, wrecked, or burned to the extent that the only residual value of the vehicle is as a source of parts or scrap metal; or
- comes into this state under a title or other ownership document that indicates the vehicle is nonrepairable, junked, for parts or dismantling only, or a similar notation.

A nonrepairable motor vehicle may not be repaired, rebuilt, reconstructed, or made operable for use on a public highway.

Owner Notification Requirements

Insurance companies must send a notice to owners who retain a salvage or nonrepairable vehicle following payment of a claim. The notice to the owner must include the following information:

- The vehicle was reported to the Texas Department of Motor Vehicles as an owner retained salvage or nonrepairable vehicle, as applicable.
- The owner is required to apply for the appropriate salvage or nonrepairable title prior to selling or otherwise transferring ownership of the motor vehicle.
- The type of title the owner must obtain (Salvage Vehicle Title or Nonrepairable Vehicle Title).
- The registration to the motor vehicle is no longer valid, and the owner may not operate or permit operation of the motor vehicle on the public roads.
- If the vehicle is <u>nonrepairable</u>, the vehicle:
 - \circ $\,$ may never be registered, operated, or permitted to operate on public roads;
 - \circ $\,$ may only be used as a source for used parts or scrap metal;
 - $\circ \;$ may not be repaired, rebuilt, or reconstructed; and
 - $\circ \;$ may only be issued a Nonrepairable Vehicle Title.
- If the vehicle is <u>salvage</u>, the owner:
 - o must apply to the Texas Department of Motor Vehicles for a Salvage Vehicle Title prior to repairing/rebuilding the vehicle;
 - o must obtain a passing vehicle safety inspection after the vehicle has been repaired or rebuilt;
 - may not operate the motor vehicle on the public roads until it has been repaired/rebuilt and retitled as a rebuilt salvage motor vehicle and properly registered; and
 - will be required to pay a \$65 Rebuilt Fee, \$28 or \$33 title application fee, and any applicable registration fees (if registering) at the time of application for a rebuilt salvage Texas title.
